Terenure Residents Assoc...AGM. 24th May 2018

The annual general meeting of the Terenure Residents Assoc. was held in St.Joseph's Hall on Thurs.24th May 2018 with Fionnuala Blake in the chair. There was a large attendance which included committee members, three public reps, Mary Freehill (Lab), Ruairi McGinley,(Ind) and Mary Feeney (FG)...apologies were received from Claire O'Connor (F.F. Paddy Smith (FG)....also in attendance were Sgt.Brendan Kelly, An Garda Siochana, and Rob Chester, Dublin City Council.

Most of the focus was on the ever increasing traffic problems in the area, recent repairs to roads and footpaths especially in the Rathdown area and Terenure Rd.West, buses passing through Terenure in the mornings already full. Cclr Mary Freehill has organised a canvass of local residents to see if there is a demand for the restoration of the bus route to St.Stephens Green.

Sgt.Kelly gave an update on crime figures in the area, notably that burglaries are slightly down but a big increase in car break-ins with key-fishing from hall tables on the increase. Also it was noted a large increase in bogus callers, especially so called handy men.....under no circumstances let any stranger into your house........

Rob Chester gave a brief summary of some of the key community projects and groups which they support in the Terenure area, most notably.

Evergreen Hall....Men's shed, Terenure Parent & Toddler Group, Tea Dances, various classes etc.

I Love Terenure 2030, Terenure Tidy Towns, Terenure Traders Assoc, Terenure/Rathgar Dog Show in Bushy Park, Bloomsday celebrations in the village, Terenure Family Festival Day in Bushy Park, various weekly walk and talk activities, Bumper Christmas Market and Tree Lighting Ceremony, and many more.

All these community events are free...... also he intimated that the removal of the unsightly bottle bank bins at the carpark was under review.

Roads and Traffic Issues

After a lot of hard work, phone calls and volumes of emails we finally secured a meeting with Dublin CEO Owen Keegan and Senior Traffic Engineer Andy Walsh on the 29th June 2017...... the following was agreed.

Roads and Footpath Repairs.

An extensive programme of road and footpath repairs was carried out by a private contractor between September 2017 and April 2018 covering the areas of Rathdown, Templeogue Road, Lakelands Park, Wasdale Grove and Park, and Greenmount Road. Some repairs remain to be addressed in a future phase of this work. To address the patchwork appearance of the repairs in Rathdown, DCC have agreed (subject to funding availability) to fully surface in tarmacadam Rathdown Drive (2019), Rathdown Crescent (2020) and to resurface Rathdown Park – the two older roads only - in

Road markings in Rathdown have been restored after the recent road and path repairs.

Traffic Issues

It was agreed that signal controlled pedestrian crossings would be installed at Terenure Road East (at Doyles Auctioneers), at Rathfarnham Road (at Hidden Hearing), and at the west end of Bushy Park Road (at the Rathfarnham Road). All to be done during works programmes in 2018.

Two comprehensive traffic surveys were carried out by DCC in August and October 2017 on rat running traffic in Rathdown with a view to the possible introduction of a right turn ban for inbound traffic at the Rathdown Avenue / Templeogue Road junction, from 7am to 10 am during weekday mornings. This measure and the results of the traffic surveys are still under consideration by DCC. In this connection also the removal of the right turn ban at Springfield Avenue / Templeogue Road junction, is to be considered in conjunction with SDCC traffic engineers.. We continue to ask, on a monthly basis, whether there is any outcome on these issues.

Following representations the timing of the full traffic cycle at the Rathdown Park / Rathfarnham Road junction has been shortened. This allows a shorter wait between Rathdown Park exit sequences at this junction – but with a similar total exit time as heretofore – approximately 12 seconds every two minutes or 10% of the total cycle time.

Following representations an extra pay and display machine has been installed at the end of Rathdown Avenue (near the junction with the Crescent).

Garda Liaison and Security

At our recent **AGM** Sgt. Brendan Kelly gave an overview of the latest crime figures for the area.

Burglaries.....slightly down on this time last year...

12 break-ins.....10 private dwellings, 2 commercial premises...most burglaries occur between 3-9pm, especially 7-8pm..be aware if just popping out for a few minutes to lock up securely.

Car break-ins....on the increase, especially due to residents leaving car keys on hall tables....key fishing on the increase. Bike thefts.....especially around Aldi and Lidl.

Bogus Tradesmen.....7-9 incidents already this year..do not allow strangers into your home under any circumstances.....they can be very persuasive and persistent in convincing you that you need certain repairs or jobs done.

Planning Matters

Permission was granted, but appealed, for three houses at the **Barn, Riversdale Avenue.** An application to part demolish and rebuild the old house has been granted.

No decision yet on Dublin City Council's proposal for **tea rooms** at **Bushy Park** (overlooking the band stand).

A refusal for an infill house in the back gardens of **38 and 40 Rathdown Park** was appealed but the decision was upheld. The application for a creche at Terenure Business Park was withdrawn.

A decision to grant permission for an infill house at **9 Rathdown Villas** has been appealed.

Healthfield Road....The request for a yellow box at the end of Healthfield Rd has been refused on appeal.

Environment

The Terenure Residents' Association believes that it can help the residents of the area and the relevant authorities to combat environmental problems and criminal activity by bringing such problems to the attention of Dublin City Council and the Gardai.
